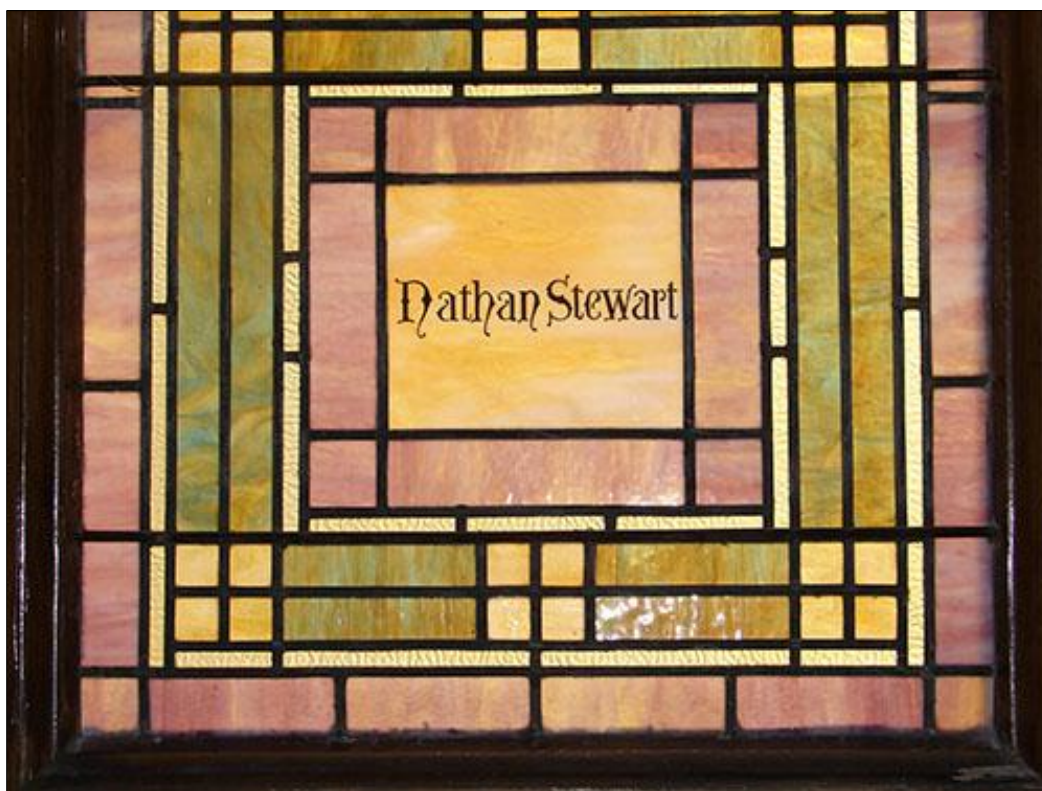

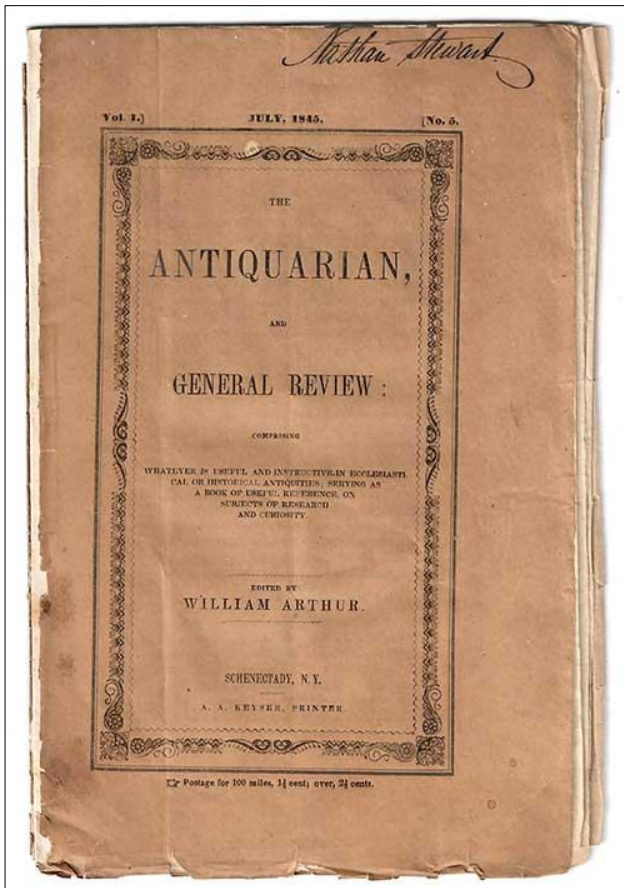

Nathan Stewart is the subject of this month's History Minute.

Nathan Stewart was born in the town of Jackson in 1812, the son of David Stewart and Elizabeth Kenyon, and died in 1900. He became a member of this church at an early age, during the pastorate of Elder Edward Barber, our second minister. He was on the search committee that brought Rev. James O. Mason here as our pastor, and, he served as a Deacon in the church for fifty- six years. (Later information discloses that he was also on the committee for constructing the present brick church.)

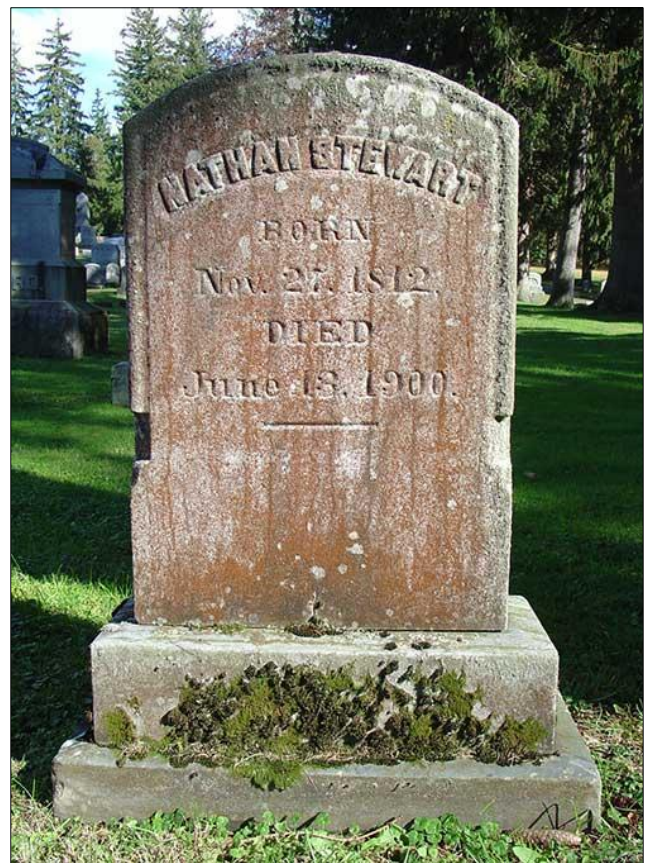


1845 "Antiquarian, and General Review" edited by William Arthur with Nathan Stewart's signature in the top right.

Going through some of our files, I came across a pamphlet, "The Antiquarian, and General Review," which had his signature at the top of the cover, and bore the date July 1845. Looking below, you'll notice that the editor was William Arthur, who preceded Rev. Mason here as our pastor, and was the father of President Chester A. Arthur.

Nathan Stewart also happens to be one of the 3rd great grandfathers of one of our current members, Sue Barber, a link stretching over five generations.

For his service to this church, we remember Nathan Stewart.
